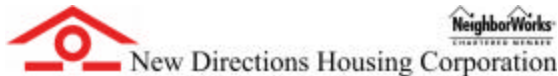

How Repair Affair works

Repair Affair's generous donors ensure that needed repair materials can be made available to volunteers whose talents and compassion are focused on helping older and disabled homeowners. Every skill is needed, every gift is leveraged.

Repairs completed are diverse as we match the skills of volunteer teams with the needed repairs.

Most repairs are completed in one day making the homes safer, more accessible and more energy efficient.

To be eligible for Repair Affair, a recipient must:

- Own and reside in the home
- Be at least 60 years old
- Or, certified as physically disabled
- Be of low income (50% of area median income or less)
- Live in Louisville, KY or Floyd or Clark County, IN

Most teams work on one of two event days in June. On event day, support volunteers produce The Breakfast of Champions—a great way to start an important day!

Volunteers also help prepare lunches and write thank you notes. "Runner" volunteers check up on teams at their houses and deliver drinks and lunches, as well as make any needed purchases and deliver supplies.

Runners help our teams to stay focused on getting the job done!
